









**Pilot Project -** *Establishing an operational programme: supporting producer organisations to contribute to strengthening farmers' position in the agrifood supply chain and improving the economic, social and environmental sustainability of farms* 



## **Project Objective:**

DG AGRI's Pilot Project aims to:

- Evaluate the advantages of producer organisations for farmers in EU agriculture, including their impact on strengthening the position of farmers in the agri-food supply chain, improving the overall sustainability of farms, and safeguarding family farms
- Create a handbook on operational programmes in all official EU languages for stakeholders that examines how producer organisations can boost the overall sustainability of their members, focusing on the livestock and plant protein sectors
- Help policymakers and stakeholders better understand the role of producer organisations and the options available to strengthen the role of producer organisations in the agri-food supply chain

## Approach:

The Pilot Project is approached through two Themes:

- **Theme 1** evaluates how producer organisations strengthen their member producers' position in the agri-food supply chain and assesses the economic, social, and environmental sustainability of farms through membership in producer organisations.
- Theme 2 identifies and analyses possible interventions implemented by producer organisations in the livestock and plant protein sectors through operational programs and assesses the impact of these interventions on the overall sustainability of their members

### **Objectives and main outputs of the Pilot Project**

### Theme 1

Does membership in a producer organisation (PO) improve the overall (economic, environmental and social) sustainability of farms and/or strengthen the position of its members in the agri-food supply chain?

### Objective

To deliver an analysis of the advantages that POs offer farmers with a quantitative assessment of the extent to which POs contribute to:

- 1. Strengthening farmers' position in the agri-food supply, and
- 2. Improving economic, social and environmental sustainability of farms



### Main Output

Technical Paper on farmer PO membership on sustainability

### Theme 2

How can producer organisations (POs) draw up operational programmes to implement sectoral interventions (improving the overall sustainability of their members)?

### Objective

To investigate how POs from four sectors (pig meat, beef meat, dairy, and plant protein) could establish operational programmes in the next CAP, to reinforce the overall sustainability of their members, with a focus on 17 types of interventions.
